### I. What does TBL mean?

- > Transnational:
  - vs. international
  - vs. cross-border
- > Business:
  - B2B vs. B2C
  - company vs. commerce vs. economic
- > Law:
  - act / statutory provisions (*lex*)
  - legal rules / rules of law (ius)



#### II. Who are the TBL-actors?

- > Companies : legal persons
  - Company's organs & functions :
    - √ shareholder / member
    - ✓ directors / board of directors vs. supervisory board
  - Commercial issues :
    - ✓ International contracts
    - ✓ Competition Tort liability Intellectual property
- > Employees : natural persons



# III. Which relationship exists between TBL-actors?

- > Companies : legal persons
  - Organs & functions : lex societatis
  - Commercial issues :
    - ✓ Contractual relationship
    - ✓ Extra-contractual relationship
- Employees : natural persons
  - Towards company : contractual relationship (employment contract)
  - Towards third person (clients / supplier / business partners)
    - ✓ Factual relationship
    - ✓ Company representatives (negotiations commitments contracts)



# IV. What kind of mobility do TBL actors have?

- Companies : legal persons
  - International transfer of seat (real vs. statutory)
  - Cross-border merger
  - International conversion of company (change of statutory seat)
- Employees : natural persons
  - Expatriate management Posting employees abroad
  - International mobility
    - Cross border commuters ("frontaliers")
    - Multiple employers
    - Multiple workplaces



# V. How to resolve disputes between TBL-actors?

- Jurisdictional vs. Non-jurisdictional method
  - Jurisdictional : judge's decision
  - Non-jurisdictional : parties' settlement (mediation conciliation)
- > Traditional (State Justice) vs. alternative (Private Justice)
  - State Justice
    - ✓ Jurisdictional Procedure : judicial proceedings
    - ✓ Non-jurisdictional Procedure : judicial mediation / conciliation
  - Private Justice
    - ✓ Jurisdictional Procedure : arbitration
    - ✓ Non-jurisdictional Procedure : mediation



### VI. What are the criteria of TBL-rules?

- > Jurisdictional authority / competence :
  - → Which tribunal (State Court / Arbitral tribunal) has jurisdiction?
- > Legislative authority / competence :
  - → Which rules shall be applied by the jurisdictional authority



### VI. What are the criteria of TBL-rules?

- > (1) Jurisdictional authority / competence :
  - Arbitral tribunals / arbitrators : choice by the parties (contractual)
  - States Courts : which national Court has jurisdiction ?
    - → PIL-rules of the seized Court (national rules vs. EU rules)
      - Choice by the parties
      - Objective determination (in the lack of choice)
        - General rules
        - Special rules
        - Protecting rules



### VI. What are the criteria of TBL-rules?

- > (2) Legislative authority / competence :
  - Arbitral tribunals / arbitrators :
    - ✓ Choice by Parties (PIL-rules) Better law approach
    - ✓ Soft law & trade usages
  - State Courts :
    - → solely PIL-rules : national (hard) law
      - Contractual issues
        - Choice by parties (a priori)
        - Objective connections
      - Extra-contractual issues
        - Choice by parties (a posteriori)

- (1) Regulation (EU) No 1215/2012 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 December 2012 on jurisdiction and the recognition and enforcement of judgments in civil and commercial matters (Brussels I bis) & Brussels Convention on jurisdiction and the enforcement of judgments in civil and commercial matters (Brussels Convention) of 27 September 1968
- 12 Lugano Convention on jurisdiction and the enforcement of judgments in civil and commercial matters (<u>Lugano Convention</u>) of 30 October 2007

- (13) Regulation (EC) No 593/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 17 June 2008 on the law applicable to contractual obligations (Rome I)
- (14) Regulation (EC) No 864/2007 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 11 July 2007 on the law applicable to non-contractual obligations (Rome II)
